—ST. JEROME

LUKE 13:22-30

THE GOSPEL READING

A tight squeeze

Because Jesus has warned of judgment as well as the challenges facing those who wish to follow him, someone asks if only a few people will be saved. Jesus uses the question to emphasize that people must act immediately and decisively if they wish to enter God's kingdom.

People squeeze through the narrow entrance into God's kingdom by radically changing their lives. Once the kingdom comes, those who didn't strive hard to follow Jesus will be shut out.

Luke again notes that Jesus is heading to the place of his death (v.22). People must follow and learn from him before it is too late, just as we must change our lives now, before the master returns.

Staking a claim

Those who knock at the closed door represent people who heard Jesus speak and/or ate with him. They think they can claim a relationship with Jesus. Because they didn't commit themselves to following him, however, Jesus rejects their claims. People's identities at this time were linked to their places of birth, which is why Jesus rejects people by declaring that he doesn't know where they're from.

At the banquet

The second part of this passage envisions the fulfillment of God's promises to bring his people into his kingdom and feed them at his heavenly banquet. Although Jesus seems to refer primarily to Jews, the reference to people coming from all directions may refer to Gentiles, as we hear in our first reading.

Those who are excluded from the heavenly gathering will be shocked that they aren't with their fellow Jews. They will be even more astonished to learn that non-Jews are there.

Jubilee Indulgence

During the Jubilee Year 2025, Catholics can apply plenary indulgences for the souls in Purgatory. To do so, they need to obtain a plenary indulgence for themselves and then designate that indulgence to the deceased.

Obtain a Plenary Indulgence:

This involves meeting the standard requirements:

- Being detached from all sin even venial.
- Receiving the Sacrament of Penance. A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental confession is encouraged in order to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart.
- Receiving Holy Communion. Additionally, receiving Communion twice in one day during the Jubilee Year, like attending two masses on Sunday, can allow for two plenary indulgences to be obtained, specifically for the souls in Purgatory.
- Praying for the Pope's intentions. These prayers are left up to the individual but an Our Father, Hail Mary, & Glory Be are suggested.

Make the Intention:

When obtaining the plenary indulgence, intentionally offer it for the benefit of the souls in Purgatory. This can be done through prayer or mental intention.

Actions During the Jubilee Year to obtain an indulgence:

- Make a pilgrimage to Rome
- Perform works of mercy.
- Fast from social media, defend life, volunteer.
- Visit your local designated Jubilee Churches.
- Vatican II formation.
- Pray in these basilicas.

For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.

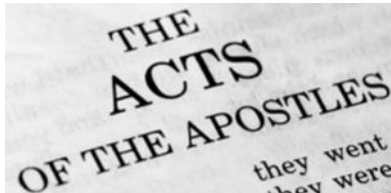

“Springs of New Hope,” based at St. Ann Catholic church, Chesapeake, Ohio, will lead a Taizé song and meditation service on Sunday September 21, at St. Joseph Catholic Church Ironton, Ohio, beginning @ 7pm.

Taizé music takes its name from the Taizé community in the Burgundy region of France, founded in the midst of World War II as a place of healing and restoration from the trauma of bombing and bullets.

The congregation is coached into three-part harmonies to simple three, four and five line chants, sung repetitively, accompanied by piano, guitar and harp. Each chant leads into meditative silence. The chants include lyrics from English, Spanish, French, Russian, Latin and other languages.

The alternation of chants with silences is meant to usher in an ethereal mood of contemplative prayer. As the chants are centered on Christ, the Holy Spirit, and the heart of the Gospel message, they are ideal for drawing people together across denominational lines for worship.

Refreshments and fellowship will follow the Taizé services. All are welcome.

Note: A second Taizé service, with a change of music, will be held October 9 at St. Ann Catholic Church, Chesapeake, beginning at 7 p.m.

Fr Peter's Sunday Reflection

Theme: I do not know where you come from, depart from me

Dear friends, today in both the first and second readings, God has shown to us that the redemption he brought, the salvation he has given us through his son Jesus is not meant for few people, rather it is meant for all the tribes and tongues and people and nations, those who are willing to be saved. This gives us hope of the restoration of the people of God. Christ will restore us back to himself since we place all our hopes in him.

In addition to gathering us unto Himself, God will also make us his ambassadors to other nations. Hence, he promises, “I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations...that have never heard of me or seen my glory.” That ambassador that God has promised to make us, is what he has fulfilled from our sacrament of baptism, and he has equipped us and given us his spirit which he confirmed on the day we received the sacrament of confirmation. We have been made soldiers and ambassadors for the kingdom of God. This shows the missionary nature of our call “Go out to the whole world and proclaim the good news.” Mark 16:15.

Second reading of today is reminding us that whom God cares for is whom he chastises. So, God corrects and chastises us not to harm us, but to lead us back to the path of righteousness Hebrews 12:5–6. The journey with God is not without

challenges, we may face trials but with obedience and submission to the will of God in his discipline, we are able to return to God.

My brothers and sisters, let us understand today that God, like a loving Father, sometimes allows us to go through hard times to shape us. He is the potter, and we are the clay—He breaks us down, reshapes us, and makes us into something beautiful in Jer 18:1–17. Jesus Himself endured suffering and death on the cross in Phil 2:8, and we are called to follow His examples.

In the gospel reading, Jesus made it clear that for us to enter the kingdom of God, we must be consistent in doing what is right. We should not be after how many people will be saved rather, we should be making sure that we are among those that will be saved. It does not matter when you started your heavenly race, but it matters if you are able to reach the end, for Christ said, first will be last, last first.

Dear friends, Christ is reminding us that the invitation to His feast is open to all, but each person must struggle to be there. We must do what we have to do by playing our roles well. This is the only way we can be guaranteed a place at the feast of the kingdom of God. The Apostle Paul reminds us in Philippians 2:12, that we should work out our salvation with fear and trembling. We must prepare ourselves daily, making use of every opportunity that the Lord places before us. Amen.
